

**STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA

EXECUTIVE ORDER 2013-10**

**WHEREAS,** The people of South Dakota are benefited by the large agricultural community within South Dakota; and,

**WHEREAS,** The Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (MAP-21) Act has been made effective by the federal government; and,


**WHEREAS,** Section 32101(d) and section 32934 of MAP-21 exempt certain agricultural activities from particular Department of Transportation Motor Carrier Safety Regulations; and,


**WHEREAS,** South Dakota law is in conflict with sections 32101(d) and 32934 of MAP-21 and does not presently include the same agricultural exemptions; and,

**IT IS, THEREFORE, BY EXECUTIVE ORDER,** Directed, notwithstanding SDCL 49-28A-3, that a state of emergency exists due to conflict between federal and state regulations, that the agricultural exemptions contained in sections 32101(d) and 32934 of the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Act shall be effective immediately within the state of South Dakota.


**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED,** This executive order shall expire upon conclusion of the emergency, but no later than June 30, 2014.
