EXECUTIVE ORDER 2011-09

WHEREAS, The state of South Dakota has been impacted by widespread flooding; and

WHEREAS, Flooding has caused significant damage to road and public infrastructure;
and,

WHEREAS, Flooding has interrupted the normal flow of emergency, school, mail,
commerce traffic; and,


WHEREAS, Substantial state, tribal, and local government resources have been
committed to help alleviate the effects of flooding; and,


WHEREAS, Federal, State, Tribal, and local officials have assessed the damage to public
infrastructure and have verified the damage reported by local governments;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Dennis Daugaard, Governor of the State of South Dakota, under
provisions of SDCL 33-15, otherwise known as the Emergency Management law, do
hereby declare a disaster to exist in Aurora, Beadle, Brookings, Brown, Buffalo, Clark,
Codington, Day, Edmunds, Faulk, Grant, Hamlin, Hand, Hughes, Hyde, Jackson, Jerauld,
Kingsbury, Lake, Marshall, Miner, Moody, Perkins, Potter, Roberts, Sanborn, Spink, and
Sully counties for three months from the date of this executive order unless further
extended by a subsequent executive order.

IT IS FURTHER DECLARED, federal resources are needed to help alleviate the impacts
of flooding to state and local governments.
