*Whereas*, The Pierre/Fort Pierre Kiwanis Club received its charter on January 19, 1922, making it the only active local service club at that time; and,

*Whereas*, Public service has always been a goal of the Pierre/Fort Pierre Kiwanis Club, leading them to undertake such projects as the construction of the Pierre Community Swimming Pool, the creation of the walnut grove at Griffin Park, and the development of Steamboat Park; and,

*Whereas*, Activities of the Pierre/Fort Pierre Kiwanis Club are concentrated on youth in the community, raising and donating thousands of dollars each year to such organizations as Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Girls State, Boys State, the Oahe YMCA, Future Business Leaders of America, the Boys & Girls Club, youth sports, and numerous post-secondary scholarships each year for high school seniors; and,

*Whereas*, The Pierre/Fort Pierre Kiwanis Club sponsored the Golden K Club, a Kiwanis Club for retired people, in 1980; and the Aktion Club, a Kiwanis Club for people with developmental disabilities, in 2007; and,


