Whereas, Eleanor Vopat was born to James and Stazie Vopat on a farmstead at Kutch, Colorado, on July 17, 1912; and,


Whereas, Eleanor married Robert Rohla on November 7, 1939, and to this union they were blessed with three children, Elenka, Robert, and Edward; and,


Now, Therefore, I, Dennis Daugaard, Governor of the state of South Dakota, do hereby proclaim July 17, 2012, as
