Whereas, George and Bonnie were blessed with one son, Nate, and now have a daughter-in-law, Tammy, along with four grandchildren; and,


Whereas, George and Bonnie will celebrate their 40th Anniversary with all the good wishes, fanfare, and celebration such a milestone warrants; and,
